A BILL

To suspend temporarily the duty on ion-exchange resin and adsorbent.

1	Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
2	$tives\ of\ the\ United\ States\ of\ America\ in\ Congress\ assembled,$
3	SECTION 1. ION-EXCHANGE RESIN AND ADSORBENT.
4	(a) IN GENERAL.—Subchapter II of chapter 99 of
5	the Harmonized Tariff Schedule of the United States is
6	amended by inserting in numerical sequence the following
7	new heading:
	" 9902.01.00 Ion-exchange resin and adsorbent, (CAS No. 69011– 20–74) (provided for in subheading 3914.00.60) Free No change No change On or before 12/31/2015 ".

- 1 (b) Effective Date.—The amendment made by
- 2 subsection (a) applies to goods entered, or withdrawn from
- 3 warehouse for consumption, on or after the 15th day after

4 the date of the enactment of this Act.

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
