III. Other product information, including uses/applications and source(s) of imports

The subject products are used for Alpine (downhill) skiing. Ski poles and parts and accessories thereof designed specifically for Nordic (cross-country) skiing are classified in the separate HTS subheading 9506.19.40 and have a rate of duty of "Free." Alpine ski poles and parts are classified in HTS statistical annotation 9506.19.80.40. The leading suppliers of U.S. imports in 2011 were Taiwan (27 percent of total U.S. imports), China (21 percent), Austria (18 percent), Italy (15 percent), Lithuania (11 percent), and the Czech Republic (6 percent). Combined, those six countries accounted for 98 percent of total U.S. imports of Alpine poles and parts in 2011.

(b) EFFECTIVE DATE.—The amendment made by
