III. Other product information, including uses/applications and source(s) of imports

The subject products are 12-volt lead acid storage batteries designed to provide immediate standby electrical power for burglar and fire alarms and similar apparatus when the main sources of electricity are unavailable. During charging, a direct current is passed through the battery, creating a number of chemical changes; this process is reversed when the battery is connected to an external circuit to provide power. Principal U.S. import sources of these batteries are China, Taiwan, and Vietnam.
