Acrylic fiber tow, continuous filament, with a nominal 320,000 filaments (plus or minus 10 percent), containing 98 percent or more by weight of acrylonitrile units, 2 percent or more but not more than 4 percent of water, and not more than 2500 ppm of sodium, with average filament measuring 1.67 decitex (plus or minus 0.08 decitex) (provided for in subheading 5501.30.00)

III. Other product information, including uses/applications and source(s) of imports

The subject products are used to make a fire-retardent textile fiber used in seating for vehicles, aircraft, and protective clothing. Also used for other industrial applications, such as insulation material. Imports are primarily from Japan and Germany. Opposition to this bill is noted below in the Contacts table.
