# A BILL

To extend the temporary suspension of duty on C12-18 alkenes, polymers (TPX) with 4-methyl-1-pentene.

- 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
- 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,
- 3 SECTION 1. C12-18 ALKENES, POLYMERS (TPX) WITH 4-
- 4 METHYL-1-PENTENE.
- 5 (a) In General.—Heading 9902.24.14 of the Har-
- 6 monized Tariff Schedule of the United States (relating to
- 7 C12-18 alkenes, polymers (TPX) with 4-methyl-1-
- 8 pentene) is amended by striking the date in the effective
- 9 period column and inserting "12/31/2015".

- 1 (b) Effective Date.—The amendment made by
- 2 subsection (a) applies with respect to goods entered, or
- 3 withdrawn from warehouse for consumption, on or after

4 the 15th day after the date of enactment of this Act.

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
