A BILL

To extend the temporary suspension of duty on sodium hypophosphite monohydrate.

- 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
- 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,
- 3 SECTION 1. SODIUM HYPOPHOSPHITE MONOHYDRATE.
- 4 (a) In General.—Heading 9902.22.44 of the Har-
- 5 monized Tariff Schedule of the United States (relating to
- 6 sodium hypophosphite monohydrate) is amended by strik-
- 7 ing the date in the effective period column and inserting
- 8 "12/31/2015".
- 9 (b) Effective Date.—The amendment made by
- 10 subsection (a) applies to goods entered, or withdrawn from

- 1 warehouse for consumption, on or after the 15th day after
- 2 the date of the enactment of this Act.

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
