A BILL

To extend the temporary reduction of duty on pepperoncini, prepared or preserved by vinegar.

- 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
- 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,
- 3 SECTION 1. PEPPERONCINI, PREPARED OR PRESERVED BY
- 4 VINEGAR.
- 5 (a) In General.—Heading 9902.10.29 of the Har-
- 6 monized Tariff Schedule of the United States (relating to
- 7 pepperoncini, prepared or preserved by vinegar) is amend-
- 8 ed by striking the date in the effective period column and
- 9 inserting "12/31/2015".

- 1 (b) Effective Date.—The amendment made by
- 2 subsection (a) applies to goods entered, or withdrawn from
- 3 warehouse for consumption, on or after the 15th day after

4 the date of the enactment of this Act.

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
