A BILL

To extend and modify the temporary reduction of duty on o-Acetylsalicylic acid (Aspirin).

1	Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
2	tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,
3	SECTION 1. O-ACETYLSALICYLIC ACID (ASPIRIN).
4	(a) In General.—Heading 9902.12.11 of the Har-
5	monized Tariff Schedule of the United States (relating to
6	o-Acetylsalicylic acid (Aspirin)) is amended—
7	(1) by striking " 3.0% " and inserting "Free" in
8	the general rate of duty column; and
9	(2) by striking the date in the effective period
10	column and inserting "12/31/2015".

- 1 (b) Effective Date.—The amendments made by
- 2 subsection (a) apply to goods entered, or withdrawn from
- 3 warehouse for consumption, on or after the 15th day after

4 the date of the enactment of this Act.

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
