4-Chloro-2-cyano-N,N-dimethyl-5-(4-methylphenyl)-1H-imidazole-1-sulfonamide (Cyazofamid Technical) (CAS No. 120116– 88–3) (provided for in subheading 2935.00.75) and any formulations containing such compound (provided for in subheading 3808.92.15)

## III. Other product information, including uses/applications and source(s) of imports

The subject products are the synthetic organic chemical cyazofamid and formulations with cyazofamid as an active ingredient. Cyazofamid is a fungicide used on crops such as potatoes, tomatoes, and cucurbits. The subject products are imported from Europe.

In addition to extending the existing HTS Chapter 99 provision, the bill modifies the article description to include imports of pure cyazofamid under HTS 2935.00.75 as well as formulations containing cyazofamid.
