# A BILL

To extend the temporary suspension of duty on mixtures containing n-butyl-1,2-benzisothiazolin-3-one and application adjuvants.

- 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
- 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,
- 3 SECTION 1. MIXTURES CONTAINING N-BUTYL-1,2-
- 4 BENZISOTHIAZOLIN-3-ONE AND APPLICATION
- 5 ADJUVANTS.
- 6 (a) In General.—Heading 9902.40.57 of the Har-
- 7 monized Tariff Schedule of the United States (relating to
- 8 mixtures containing n-butyl-1,2-benzisothiazolin-3-one
- 9 and application adjuvants) is amended by striking the date
- 10 in the effective period column and inserting "12/31/2015".

- 1 (b) Effective Date.—The amendment made by
- 2 subsection (a) applies to goods entered, or withdrawn from
- 3 warehouse for consumption, on or after the 15th day after

4 the date of the enactment of this Act.

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
