The subject products include various non-optical microscopes, including electron microscopes that are used in the researching and testing or manufacturing of semiconductor devices. Additional microscopes include scanning electron (SEM), transmission electron (TEM), scanning probe, electron diffraction, and, to a lesser extent, proton microscopes. The general application of these microscopes is to reveal the texture, chemical composition, and crystalline structure and orientation of a particular sample. Germany is the largest supplier of these products to the United States.
