Mr. Huelskamp introduced the following bill; which was referred to the Committee on Ways and Means

### A BILL

To suspend temporarily the duty on footwear for men with outer soles and uppers of rubber or plastics, covering the ankle, other than work footwear.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,

SECTION 1. FOOTWEAR FOR MEN WITH OUTER SOLES AND

UPPERS OF RUBBER OR PLASTICS, COVERING THE ANKLE, OTHER THAN WORK

FOOTWEAR.

(a) IN GENERAL.—Subchapter II of chapter 99 of
the Harmonized Tariff Schedule of the United States is

amended by inserting in numerical sequence the following
