III. Other product information, including uses/applications and source(s) of imports

The subject product, commonly known as "vacuum-grade ferroniobium," is used in the manufacture of steel products by vacuum melting, and for applications requiring ferroniobium with very low content levels of sulfur, phosphorus, or silicon. Imports are from Brazil (about 85 percent), the United Kingdom, and Germany. Ferroniobium is also called "ferrocolumbium." There is at least one domestic producer as noted below in the contacts table.
