## III. Other product information, including uses/applications and source(s) of imports

The subject products are input materials for ceramic discharge lamps and articles made from such cermets. Cermets are metal ceramic composite materials. The cermets used in ceramic discharge lamps are a combination of ceramic and molybdenum. The products are part of the electrical feedthroughs to the electrodes in ceramic metal halide discharge tubes specifically for Philips High Intensity Discharge Lamps. Imports of these cermets come from the Netherlands and Belgium. There is no known U.S. production of these cermets and no confirmed users other than Philips Lighting Company.

# V. Technical comments

The article description set forth above was simplified compared to the bill as drafted. We note that this provision is drafted as an "actual use" provision requiring post-entry verification by Customs officials and thereby posing some administrative burden on Customs and the importers. However, given the breadth of the permanent tariff category and the specific desired end use, this requirement is likely to be the simplest method of limiting the product scope to the desired goods.
