#### II. Suggested article description(s) for enactment (including appropriate HTS subheading(s)):

Ceramic bases designed for high-intensity discharge (HID) lamps, such bases having metal locking pins to allow passage of an electrical current (provided for in subheading 8536.61.00)

(If enacted, the tariff relief provided for in this bill would be available to any entity that imports the product that is covered by the bill.)

#### III. Other product information, including uses/applications and source(s) of imports

The subject products are components of high-intensity discharge (HID) lamps. In HID lamps, light is created by an electric arc between two electrodes. Three common HID lamp types are mercury vapor, metal halide, and high-pressure sodium lamps. They are typically used in outdoor lighting applications (e.g., stadiums and street lights) or to light large indoor areas (e.g., retail space and indoor arenas). The subject products are specialized lamp bases made of ceramic. The bases have two keyed pins that snap into a socket with a slight twist. The principal source of imports of the subject products is China. Opposition to this bill is noted below in the Contacts table.

## A BILL

To suspend temporarily the duty on ceramic bases designed for high intensity discharge (HID) lamps, with metal locking pins to allow passage of an electrical current.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,

SECTION 1. CERAMIC BASES DESIGNED FOR HIGH INTENSITY DISCHARGE (HID) LAMPS, WITH METAL

LOCKING PINS TO ALLOW PASSAGE OF AN

ELECTRICAL CURRENT.
