II. Suggested article description(s) for enactment (including appropriate HTS subheading(s)):

Laboratory, hygienic, or pharmaceutical glassware, whether or not graduated or calibrated, of low expansion borosilicate glass or alumino-borosilicate glass, having a linear coefficient of expansion not exceeding 3.3 x 10-6 per Kelvin within a temperature range of 0 to 300 degrees C (provided for in subheading 7017.20.00)

(If enacted, the tariff relief provided for in this bill would be available to any entity that imports the product that is covered by the bill.)

The description in the current HTS heading does not conform to the ASTM standard for the product, according to information received from the interested entity. Consequently, the article description set forth above was modified to read "...not exceeding 3.3 x 10-6 per Kelvin..." and not "...not exceeding 3.3 x 10-7 per Kelvin..." as in the current heading. We note that the "-6" following "10" should be written as superscript characters.

Although the title of the bill has no legal significance, it would be clearer to reflect that the bill is a renewal of a duty
reduction, rather than an extension of a duty suspension, because the most recent effective period of this provision expired
December 31, 2009, and the tariff rate was reduced to 3.6 percent ad valorem from 6.7 percent ad valorem.
