III. Other product information, including uses/applications and source(s) of imports

The subject product, liquid crystal display (LCD) panel assemblies, consists of a liquid crystal layer fitted between two sheets or plates of glass or plastic, whether or not fitted with electrical connections. The existing tariff heading requires that the LCD panel assemblies be imported for use in LCD direct view televisions (TVs), the most common type of televisions sold today. There is no known U.S. production of LCD panel assemblies for LCD projection type televisions. Korea is the leading supplier of this product.

1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-

2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,

3 SECTION 1. LIQUID CRYSTAL DISPLAY (LCD) PANEL ASSEM4 BLIES.

(a) IN GENERAL.—Heading 9902.85.21 of the Harmonized Tariff Schedule of the United States (relating to
liquid crystal display (LCD) panel assemblies) is amended
by striking the date in the effective period column and
inserting "12/31/2015".

(b) EFFECTIVE DATE.—The amendment made by
 subsection (a) applies to goods entered, or withdrawn from
 warehouse for consumption, on or after the 15th day after
 the date of the enactment of this Act.
