## II. Suggested article description(s) for enactment (including appropriate HTS subheading(s)):

Cathode-ray data/graphic display tubes, color, with a phosphor dot screen pitch smaller than 0.4 mm, and with a less than 90 degree deflection (provided for in subheading 8540.40.10)

#### III. Other product information, including uses/applications and source(s) of imports

The subject products are color cathode-ray data/graphic display tubes with a phosphor dot screen pitch smaller than 0.4 mm and with a deflection angle of less than 90 degrees (provided for in subheading 8540.40.10). These tubes may be used in particular types of displays for desktop computers where sharper image resolution is desired. The likely source of U.S. imports is Japan.
