Bunch Library at the Department of State. Established in 1789, the Bunche Library is the oldest official federal library. The library houses a large and unique collection of unclassified and published information sources on foreign relations. Now serving nearly 40,000 State Department employees, the library's staff and collection support U.S. diplomatic efforts worldwide. The morning will feature an overview of the Bunche Library and a tour of the facilities.
