Learn how libraries of all types are using use Web conferencing to create programs and training sessions for library users and library staff members.

One such group is OPAL (Online Programming for All Libraries), an international collaborative of libraries based in Illinois. Using a presentation created by the Library of Congress for OPAL, this program will

- discuss program development considerations when planning for webconference delivery; and
- highlight accessibility features built into this Americans with Disabilities Act-compliant tool.
