The Library of Congress Preservation Directorate and the Northeast Document Conservation Center (NEDCC) have partnered with FLICC to present a FREE self-paced online that covers the preservation

of paper collections and related formats. Complete this course between June 1 and July 31, 2009 to prepare for the August Institute and to learn at your desk how to identify deteriorated materials, properly

care for collections and set priorities for preservation. FLICC and LC Preservation Directorate staff will also be on call for consultation while you are taking the course and will facilitate a live online forum midway through the course.

Graduates of both the NEDCC course and the August Institute can then register for three follow-up online preservation courses at a 50% discount off the a la carte price. Taught by experienced preservation professionals from Lyrasis (formerly SOLINET and PALINET), you will learn to apply preservation principles and processes in your institution and explore special topics like audiovisual oversize and digital materials plus preservation responses to facility construction, disaster planning and product evaluation.
