Metro (Two Options)

From Union Station (Red line)

Cross Columbus Circle in front of the station and walk up Delaware Avenue to the Russell Senate Office Building. At the northeast corner of C St. and Delaware Ave., enter the "Lower Delaware Door." Pass through security and the entranceway, turn right and walk to the end of the corridor. Make a soft left and walk 2/3rds down the corridor to room B-15.

From Capital South (Orange & Blue lines)

Walk north along 1st St. to Constitution Ave. Enter the Russell Senate Office Building from the southwest corner of Constitution and 1st sts. After passing through security and the entranceway, proceed to the basement level. Walk down hall to Room B-15.

The Senate Library provides a wide range of information services to the Senate community and maintains one of the nation's foremost collections of congressional documents. Librarians

provide legislative research, answer reference questions on a variety of topics and teach research classes. Research services are nonpartisan, often current events-oriented and available as late as the Senate is in session.

Library resources and services are reserved primarily for Senators, Senate staff, Senate and House committees and members of the accredited press. However, the library publishes lots of timely information on senate.gov.

The tour will feature special collections, senate.gov resources and address policies pursuant to the mission of the Senate Library.
