### **Dominic Davies**

Dominic Davies received his Ph.D. in Chemistry in 1998 from the University of Essex for his work on the effect of pressure on molecular motion in the solid state. He also worked at the Centre for Phosphor and Display Materials at the University of Greenwich on a DARPA funded advanced displays program.

In 2002, Davies joined the UK Defence Science and Technology Laboratory (DSTL) as a member of the Knowledge Agent team. In recognition of its work, this team was awarded the Best Information Team in the Public Sector Award at the International Information Industry Awards 2003. In 2009, he took over as the team leader for one of the four Knowledge Management and Exploitation Teams across DSTL. Also in the fall of 2009, Davies was elected to act as the Chair of the NATO Information Management Committee, and in 2010, he was asked to be the Group Leader for the Knowledge Management and Exploitation Group, part of the Knowledge and Information Services Department.
