The Office of Personnel Management's Position Classification Standard for Librarian Series, GS-1410 has not been updated since 1994 and it no longer fully reflects the duties, tasks and levels of complexity of the work done by occupants of this series. In order to more fully employ their knowledge skills and abilities and to improve their professional options federal librarians are increasingly moving out of the 1410 series to work in other federal job series. As the world of information content management and the librarian profession continue to develop the qualifications and standards for the 1410 series will become less relevant to the work performed by federal librarians in response to the needs of federal organizations.

Federal librarians and information professionals need to evaluate the current situation and develop a plan for creating a viable future for current and incoming federal library and information professionals

This panel discussion on the Future of the 1410 Series will be the first in a series of conversations on this topic.
