The United States Institute of Peace Library serves the staff and researchers of the Institute of Peace, an independent, nonpartisan conflict management center created by Congress to prevent and mitigate international conflict without resorting to violence. Specialized ejournals, databases and a core library print collection of more than 6,000 items are available to staff, academy course participants and visiting researchers.



The collection focuses on conflict prevention, management and resolution, negotiation and mediation, peace education, promotion of the rule of law, peace building, state building and civil society, among other topics relevant to the institute's work.

Visitors will tour the institute's brand new headquarters building, including the library, and learn how the library provides services to Institute staff in the U.S. and abroad. All guests must have a valid photo ID for entry. Screening of visitors entering the building using metal detectors is required. All handbags, briefcases, laptops, etc. must be placed on the x-ray machines for scanning.
