IT'S A GAMBLE Scenario # 4

Category: Staff Time and Attendance

WHAT'S WRONG:

In-Kind Documentation form

- 1. The form is showing the value of the time based on budgeted rather than actual time (i.e. the percentage).
- 2. The salary for Sally Super is inconsistent from the amount listed in the "Salary" cell and the salary base used to calculate the value of time.
- 3. Stanford Supervisor did not sign the in-kind documentation sheet.
- **4.** May question the reasonableness of Stanford's percentage of time for 1 minimum-time member vs. Sally's percentage of time for 3 full-time members Stanford's percentage may seem high for only supervising 1 minimum time member.
- 5. The in-kind documentation form is for the first quarter of 2009 (Jan-Feb); the staff signed the documentation form on January 5 which is prior to the end date of the period covered which makes the value again based on budgeted and not actual.

• Site Supervisor Time Sheets

- 6. No time sheets are available for Stanford to show his actual hours.
- 7. Sally's time is based on budgeted time instead of actual hours worked.
- **8.** Sally and her supervisor both signed her timesheets prior to the completion of the month of February (signed on February 4 and the timesheet is covering the whole month of February).

WHAT ARE SOME NEXT STEPS OR CORRECTIVE ACTION

- In-kind donation forms for staff time should show actual time spent timesheets should be available to document the actual time.
- If timesheets aren't available for Stanford, the program may have Stanford and Boss Brown have a form/note to file notarized and signed both Stanford and Boss that certifies the time served including the time period covered and the actual hours worked.
- All documentation should be verified for accuracy and reasonableness.
