

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UNITED STATES ATTORNEYS STATISTICAL REPORT
FOR THE FISCAL YEAR ENDED JUNE 30, 1955

The fiscal year ending as of June 30, 1955 was one in which United States Attorneys made substantial progress in the reduction of their backlog of pending cases both civil and criminal. The pending caseload was reduced from 31,286 to 29,979, a reduction of 4.2 per cent or 1,307 cases. Chart 1 shows that the pending caseload dropped below 30,000 cases for the first time since Fiscal Year 1951.

Exclusive of routine immigration cases in the five districts bordering on Mexico, there was a decrease of less than one per cent in cases filed, and an increase of slightly over five and a half per cent in cases terminated.

A large increase took place in collections which amounted to \$27,470,493.56, an increase of approximately 30% over the preceding year.

TOTAL U.S. CASES PENDING





CHART NO. 2

CRIMINAL CASES PENDING (AS OF JUNE 30, 1955):

Criminal cases pending as of the end of the year totalled 8,945, 1,542 less than were pending at the close of Fiscal Year 1954. Of this number, 3,998 or 44.7 % were in ten districts. Twenty-five districts have 5,835 pending cases or 68.5 % of the total.

2,522 or 28.2 % of these cases are in a status beyond the control of United States Attorneys, e.g. fugitive. The District of Columbia has 490 such cases pending at the close of the fiscal year. In other words the backlog of criminal cases which can actually be processed is 6,423 cases. Of the 6,423 cases, 1,343 are awaiting arraignment in court, 2,578 are either awaiting trial or being tried and 891 are awaiting sentence. The following table gives a breakdown of the cases pending according to status.

TOTAL 8,945 CASES





Chart 3 illustrates in graphic form the ten districts with the highest case load as compared with the total pending figure.

A study of the Criminal cases pending reveals that 10 types of violations represent 59.3 % of the total. The following table and Chart 4 give a picture of the volume of cases by categories.

There are 14,264 criminal complaints involving 18,963 defendants in a preliminary stage. Of this number, 2,733 are under consideration for prosecution, 3,071 are awaiting grand jury action, 3,977 are awaiting completion of investigations, 2,384 are in a fugitive or other status beyond the control of the United States Attorney. This total of 6,557 represents 46% of the complaints pending in all districts.


35 per cent of the pending criminal cases and 64 per cent of the complaints are less than six months old. Of the 504 cases that are 5 or more years old 173 are pending in the District of Columbia and 109 are pending in Southern New York. However, of this number 270 are in a fugitive or other status beyond the control of the United States Attorney.

The following table indicates the percentage of cases according to age bracket that are in a fugitive or other status beyond the control of United States Attorneys. It will be noted that the ratio of fugitives etc. rises as the age of the case increases. Where 11.2 per cent of the cases less than 1 year of age are in a fugitive status, 88.7 per cent of the cases over 5 years of age are in that status.


For the year ending June 30, 1955, 37,684 criminal cases involving 46,367 defendants were filed, 14,283 by indictment, 20,734 by information, 1,245 were received by transfer from other districts and 1,422 were filed by other methods such as removals from state courts.

Chart 6 gives a comparison of the cases filed by fiscal year from 1950 through 1955.

During the year, United States Attorneys received 95,828 complaints involving 121,386 defendants. The largest single group of complaints involved possible infractions of National Stolen Property Act Laws.

The following table indicates the number of cases and complaints filed by type of violation.

Chart 7 groups the cases filed according to offense by major categories for Fiscal Year 1942 to 1955 inclusive.

A substantial decrease will be noted in the number of Immigration violations. However, increases occurred in National Stolen Property Act, Postal Law, Counterfeiting, and Forgery Violations. Gamblers Occupational Tax cases increased from 369 to 599 cases.

Western Texas had the greatest number of cases filed, namely 3,953 cases of which 3,550 were immigration cases. Arizona, Southern California, and Southern Texas had 1,931, 620 and 2,406 respectively of this type of case. Excluding Immigration cases, the District of Columbia with 1,350 cases and Southern New York with 1,186 had the greatest number of cases filed per district.

Chart 8 indicates the number of grand jury proceedings handled by United States Attorneys for Fiscal Year 1950 to 1955 inclusive.

UNITED STATES ATTORNEYS CASES FILED





CHART NO. 8

CRIMINAL CASES AND MATTERS CLOSED DURING FISCAL YEAR 1955:

United States Attorneys and their staffs closed 39,226 criminal cases involving 48,827 defendants; and 60,779 complaints involving 78,124 defendants. 29,930 cases were terminated with guilty pleas, or 76.3 of the total cases closed. A total of 3,351 defendants in 2,412 cases were found guilty after a jury or court trial. By obtaining pleas of guilty United States Attorneys saved the government a great deal of expense and time. With respect to the termination of criminal cases by plea, reference is made to a remark of the Director of the Federal Bureau of Investigation in which he pointed out to the subcommittee on appropriations for the House of Representatives that savings in trial and court costs resulting from a plea amount to \$2,873.86 per case.¹ Based on 29,930 cases so closed the estimated savings to the government would amount to \$86,014,629.80.

Of the 60,779 complaints closed 50,879 involving 65,734 defendants were by declination of prosecution. Chart 9 gives a comparison of the number of cases closed for fiscal years 1950 to 1955. Table 3 B in the Appendix gives a breakdown by district of the method of disposition of criminal cases and defendants.

CRIMINAL CASES TERMINATED




Table 3 C furnishes a breakdown of the disposition of defendants in Criminal cases according to type of offense.

With the exception of Fiscal Year 1953, more criminal trials were conducted by United States Attorneys during fiscal year 1955 than in any year since 1950 as shown on Chart 10.

TRIALS IN CRIMINAL CASES





CHART NO. II

CIVIL CASES AND MATTERS PENDING (AS OF JUNE 30, 1955)

Civil cases pending in United States Attorneys' Offices amounted to 21,034 exclusive of Tax Lien cases of which there are 1,197 cases pending.* Of this number, 10,497 or 49.9 per cent are pending in 12 districts. Chart 12 illustrates in graphic form the twelve districts with the largest case loads as compared to the case load for all districts.

Exclusive of Land Acquisition and Civil Tax cases, there are 17,175 cases pending involving \$394,346,720. In 9,557 of these, the United States as plaintiff is seeking to recover \$234,099,852. In the 6,165 suits in which the government is defendant, \$135,598,883 is involved. There are 1,453 cases involving \$24,647,985 in which the United States is joined as a party.

The largest single group of cases in which the government is plaintiff are negotiable instrument cases (principally FHA defaulted notes). There are 3,114 cases in this group.

Chart 13 depicts the proportionate number of each type of case. The following table indicates the number of cases pending according to type of case, the amounts involved, and how the United States participates.





An analysis of the status of civil cases pending in United States Attorneys' offices discloses some interesting facts on the progress being made in disposing of the backlog. For instance, 5,348 or 31.1 per cent of the civil cases pending in court are at issue or awaiting trial; 1,571 are awaiting service of process, and 1,569 are awaiting opponent's motion or other pleadings or 18.2 per cent of the pending cases. Following is a table giving a breakdown according to status category.

Of the 19,932 civil matters pending, 9,300 are contract actions consisting of 8,482 negotiable instrument cases, namely 46.7 and 42.6 per cent respectively of the total. Another large group is the 5,563 veterans' matters which comprises 28 per cent of the total.

A breakdown of pending civil cases and matters (other than Civil Tax and Land Condemnation) according to amount category shows that 67.4 per cent of pending matters involve amounts of \$1,000 or less. 12.7 per cent of the civil matters and 39.3 per cent of the pending civil suits do not involve money claims. 31.2 per cent of the suits involve amounts of \$1,000 or less. Eleven per cent of the pending suits are for amounts of \$10,000 and over. The following table gives information as to number of cases and matters in each category.



An analysis of the status of civil matters pending in United States Attorneys' offices discloses some interesting facts on the progress being made in disposing of backlogs.

For instance, installment payments are being made in 3,132 of the 19,932 pending matters. Answers to demand letters are being awaited in 5,280 matters or 26.5 per cent of the total. CIVIL CASES AND MATTERS RECEIVED:

During the year 20,753 civil cases were filed, an increase of 4.05 per cent over the 19,946 cases filed during Fiscal Year 1954. As the following table indicates, 38.6 per cent of the cases were filed in ten districts. Chart No. 15 gives a comparison of the number of cases filed each fiscal year since 1950 and Table 3 A in the Appendix gives the number of cases filed in each district during the fiscal year.



Of the civil cases filed the United States was plaintiff in 14,213 involving \$172,606,068. Two categories, namely 5,558 negotiable instrument suits for \$10,138,791 and 2,677 veterans' suits for \$8,276,456 made up over half of the total.


Cases in which the United States was designated as defendant amounted to 3,967 with \$61,738,605 involved. Of this amount, \$40,203,208 is indicated in 891 Tort Actions filed against the government during the past year.

Civil matters received by United States Attorneys amounted to 27,303. This is a decrease of 5.67 per cent from the 28,945 civil matters received in Fiscal Year 1954. Nevertheless, as chart 16 indicates, the figure for this past fiscal year is the greatest number received since Fiscal Year 1950 except for Fiscal Year 1954. In 14 out of the 94 judicial districts, 600 or more civil matters were received as shown by the following table.


During the fiscal year ending June 30, 1955, 20,519 civil suits were terminated, an increase of 9.15 per cent over the 18,799 terminated during the previous fiscal year. As Chart 17 indicates this is the largest number of cases terminated for the past six fiscal years.

As in the case of civil suits filed, the largest groups, according to type in suits terminated, were Negotiable Instrument cases with 5,369 and Veterans' Matters 2,493. The following table will give a breakdown of cases terminated according to major cause of action.

COLLECTIONS


Increasing stress is being placed on the importance of the collection of monies owed the government. United States Attorneys and their staffs collected \$27,470,493.56 during the fiscal year ending June 30, 1955. This total is approximately three times greater than the amount appropriated for the United States Attorneys offices, therefore, for every dollar appropriated, almost three dollars was collected. Expenditures increased from \$7,913,737.64 in fiscal year 1954 to \$9,266,979.89 for fiscal year 1955 and the average amount collected for each dollar expended increased from \$2.68 to about three dollars.

It is worthy of note that the largest increase in collections occurred during the last six months of the fiscal year and in collections without actual suit or prosecution. Where \$10,162,295.90 was collected in this manner during 1954, \$16,875,586.23 was collected during 1955. This is an increase of 66.1 per cent over the preceding year. Chart 18 depicts amounts collected as compared with amounts appropriated for fiscal year 1950 through 1955 inclusive. The Financial Summary table in the Appendix will show amounts collected by district as well as amounts imposed in fines, judgments etc.

PERSONNEL AND EXPENDITURES

An average of 1,462 employees were employed in United States Attorneys' offices, and \$9,279,130 appropriated for their activities. During the year, 293 employees were appointed and 270 separated, representing a net gain of 23 employees.

Based on a case load of 89,723 cases, the average cost per case handled was \$103.28. Comparing appropriations with collections, it will be noted on chart 18 that for every dollar appropriated, United States Attorneys collected approximately three, thus, more than "paying their way" in Fiscal Year 1955.

"UNITED STATES ATTORNEYS OFFICES"




CHART NO. 20

"UNITED STATES ATTORNEYS OFFICES"


