Course Description	<p>The purpose of the program is to facilitate the transformation of DoD logistics by introducing participants to leading-edge developments in logistics thinking in DoD, academia, and industry. The program also promotes the exchange of ideas within the greater logistics community toward the objective of enhancing the National Defense posture. The program exposes the participant to such topics as the following: Production Life Cycle for Design and Maintenance; Fundamentals of Supply Chain Management; Performance-Based Logistics; Business Transformation; Supply Chain Activity; Logistics Modernization Program; Enterprise Resource Planning; Global Combat Support System; and a platform to discuss other real-world issues. Case studies from both Defense and Industry are reviewed, analyzed, and discussed with regard to concepts, policies, applicability to the DoD environment. Guest speakers, group exercises and computer-based models are used to stimulate and explore "out-of-the-box" thinking about the future of logistics. Participation in pre- and post-program web-based learning activities is required.</p>

Information will be provided by Army Materiel Command prior to the course start date.• A welcome dinner/reception begins on Sunday evening at 1800 hours. Class concludes on Friday at 1300 hours. Dress is business casual for all participants.• Travel order must state lodging and meals are included in tuition

- 3) Copy of most recent Standard Form 50, Notification of Personnel Action
- 4) [SF 182](#), Authorization, Agreement, and Certification of Training). This training form must accompany the nomination package but will only be processed if the nominee is selected to attend the course.
