**FORT LEONARD WOOD, Mo.** – Answering an Army Provider Level Satisfaction Survey with positive feedback can help get additional funding for the General Leonard Wood Army Community Hospital to help provide better services for its customers.

"Those who receive an APLSS survey in the mail following a visit should fill out the survey completely and mail it in the self-addressed envelope provided," GLWACH Commander Kirk Eggleston said.

"You can also follow the attached directions and go online to complete the survey electronically. The two best response options to the survey questions result in monetary rewards for GLWACH, while the median or lower responses result in a decrement in our funding from the Army Medical Command," Eggleston said.

One limitation to the APLSS survey is that the responses and comments are anonymous, so GLWACH is unable to view details or respond to individual concerns.

"Please notify clinic leadership or use the ICE system (Interactive Customer Evaluation), which allows us to provide you with fast, personalized feedback if you have a concern," Eggleston said.

"For immediate response--even faster than an ICE comment or locating clinic leadership--contact a patient representative," Eggleston said.

Also located near the Patient Representative Office is an interactive ICE machine for making an ICE comment electronically. The Information Desk offers ICE comment cards for making an ICE comment the old fashioned way, by hand.
