FORT LEONARD WOOD, Mo. – Former New Jersey State Trooper and NBA referee Bob Delaney is

scheduled to visit Fort Leonard Wood Oct. 17-18 to share his experience with Post Traumatic Stress

after spending several years undercover.

The purpose of the PTS outreach program is to speak to installation students, permanent party, staff and spouses in order to provide the audience a better definition and understanding of the causes, symptoms, and impacts of PTS, and how to assist those affected.

Additionally, PTS outreach increases awareness for soldiers affected by PTS and works to reduce the stigma commonly associated with seeking help.

Presentations are open to the public and will take place at Abrams Theater.
