MSCoE Mission



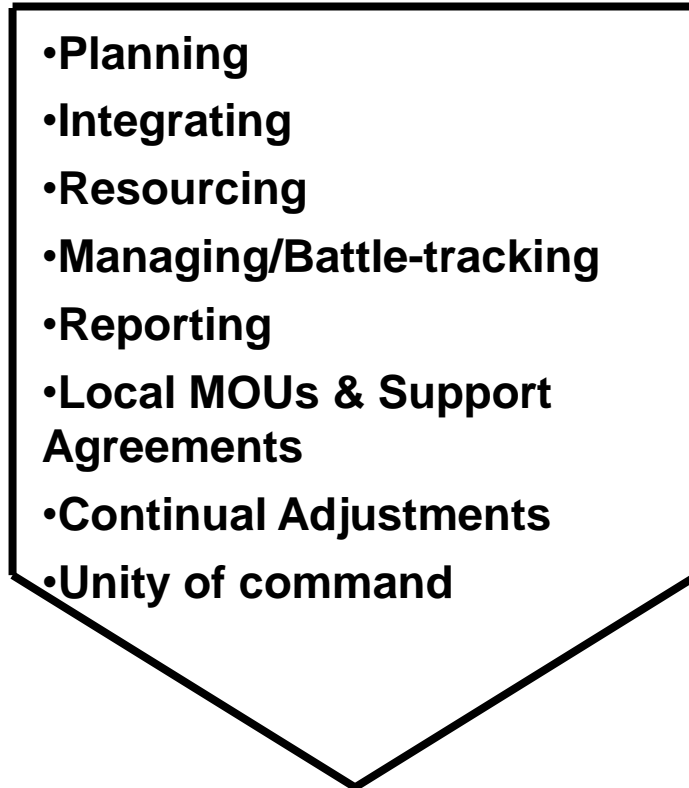
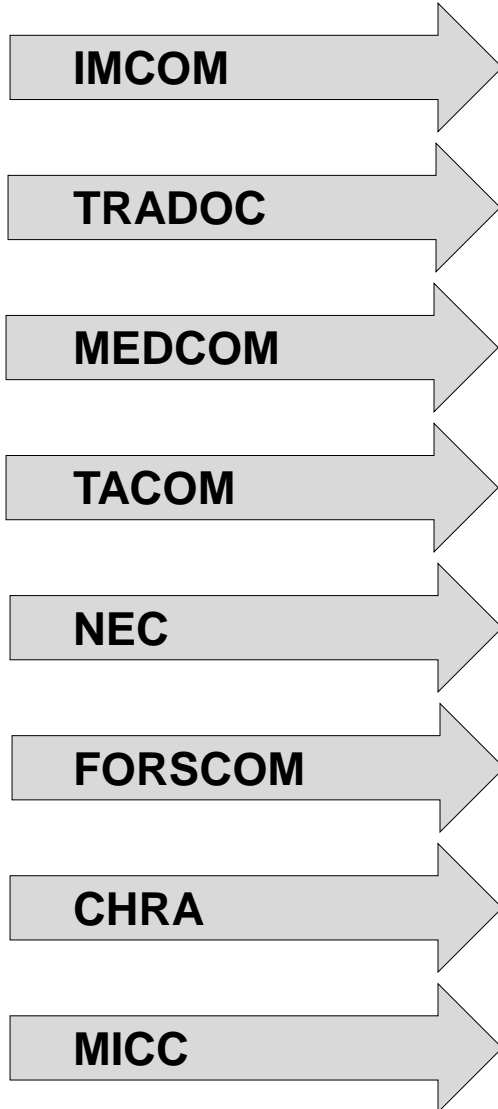

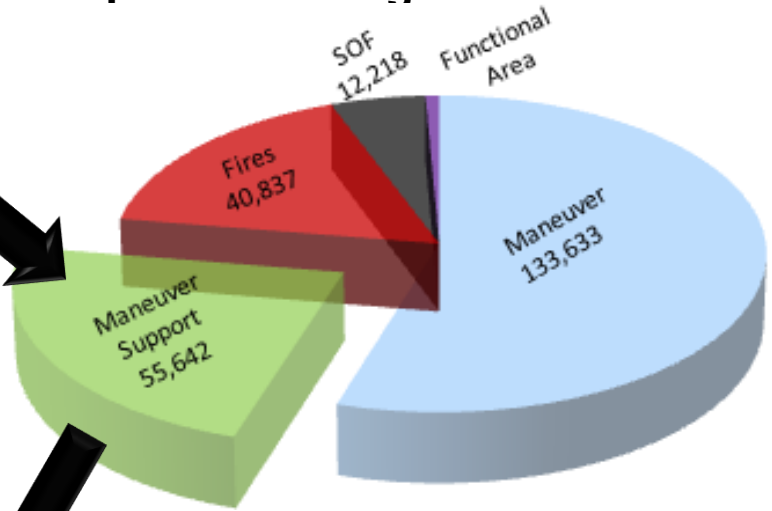
Active Duty Maneuver Support Strength



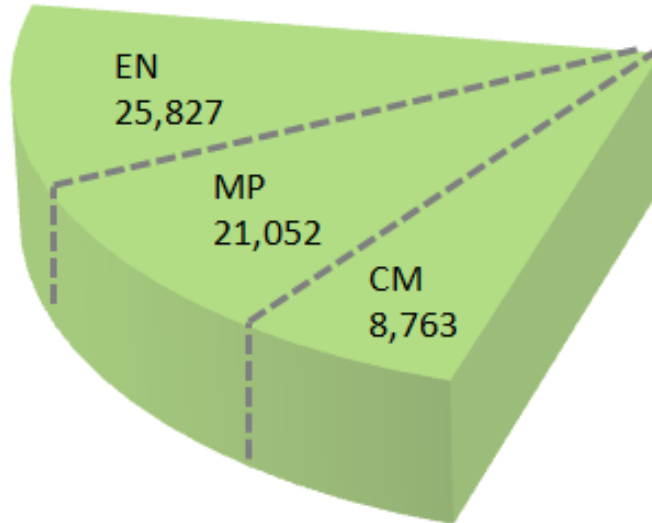
Active Component Strength

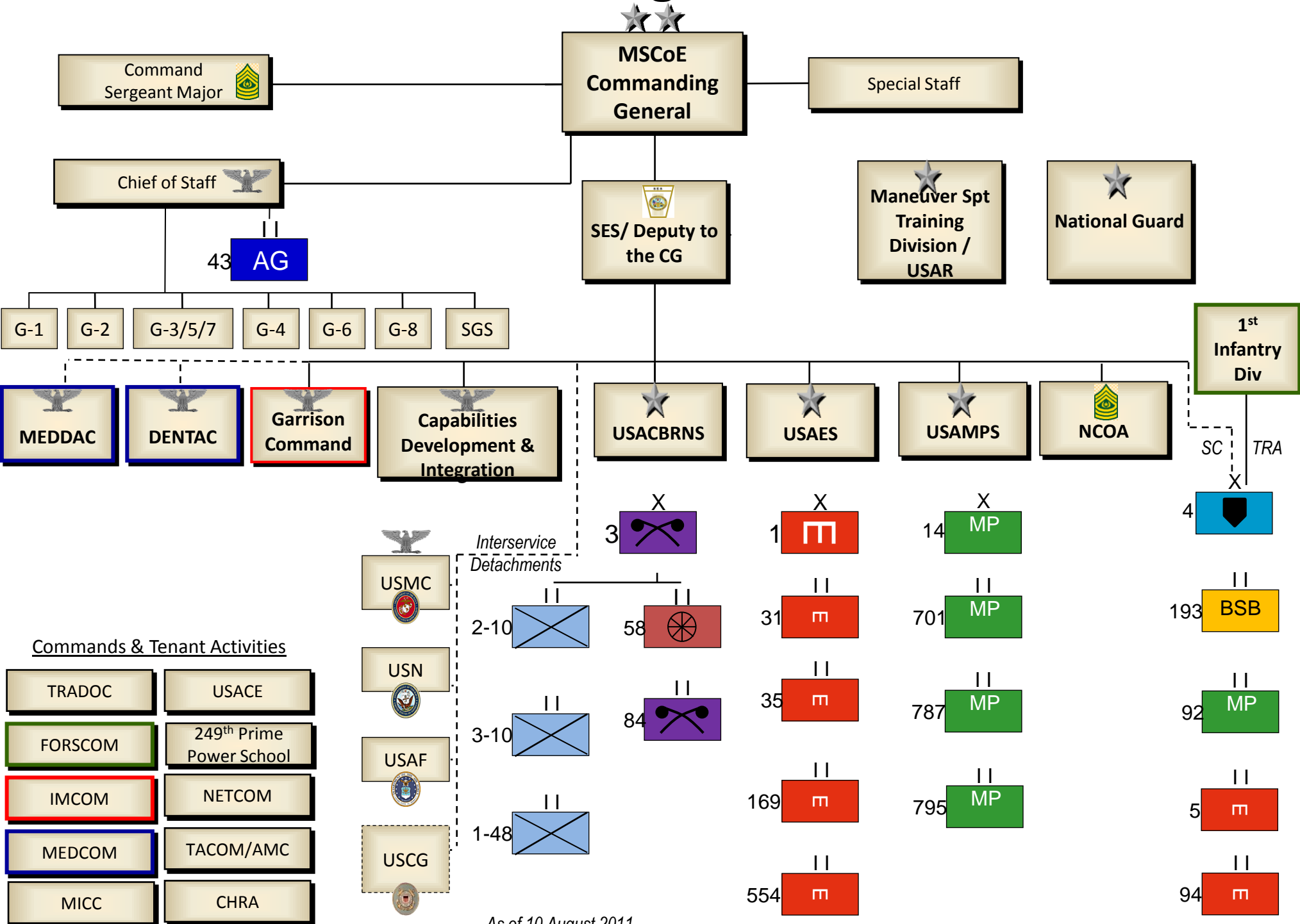

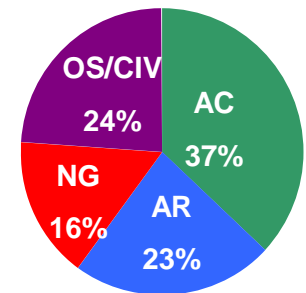
