## 1122 Program Expansion

Section 1122 of the fiscal year 1994 National Defense Authorization Act established the authority for states and units of local government to purchase law enforcement equipment through federal procurement channels, provided that the equipment is utilized in the performance of counter-drug activities. The Duncan Hunter National Defense Authorization Act for Fiscal Year 2009 amended 10 U.S.C. 381, to expand the procurement authority under the 1122 Program beyond counter-drug activities, to include equipment for homeland security and emergency response activities.

In August 2009, additional schedules and SIN items were made available to six pilot states (California, Arizona, Nevada, North Carolina, Florida and Georgia) for homeland security and emergency response activities. Starting July 11, 2011, the 1122 program will be expanded to all states that choose to participate in the program and have certified State Points of Contact (SPOCs) (see below). These authorized SPOCs will now be eligible to purchase under the 1122 program, in support of homeland security, emergency response, and counter-drug activities. The national Schedule and SIN list for the expansion in the 1122 Program catalog will be the same list of equipment previously approved under the 1122 pilot program. This program is still limited to the purchase of equipment only.

The authority for the 1122 Program resides with the Department of Defense (DoD). The U.S. Army is the executive agent of the program. In addition, under this program, DoD and the Defense Logistics Agency (DLA) also provide equipment available to state and local units of government. The Army currently defines the requirements for the expansion of the program and the certification of the SPOCs.

Participation by each State is voluntary and determined by the Governor's office in each state. The SPOC in each state manages and places orders under this program. The SPOC also determines that the purchase falls under the appropriate scope of the program, the items are available from one of the 3 sources of supply, and that funds are available to make the purchase.

Please review the following key authorization components:

• State Point of Contact (SPOC) Certification Guidelines

Effective July 11, 2011 only those SPOCs meeting the following mandatory requirements will be authorized to request material from the 1122 Program sources of supply. States without a designated and certified SPOC are ineligible to participate in any part of the 1122 Program.

- 1. SPOC certification or completion of interim training sessions.
- 2. Current SPOC appointment orders from the Governor.
- 3. Annual report submission for the period 1 January 31 December 2010.
- 4. DOD approved PKI External Certificate Authority (EAC) digital certificate (required for DOD EMAIL accounts).

- Schedule Contractor Guidelines
  - Acceptance of orders from the state or local government is voluntary for Schedule holders that fall under approved Schedules and SINs. Contractors listed in Schedules and SINs not noted in the catalog, may not participate in this program.
  - 2. Schedule contractors may decline an order, for any reason, within a five-day period after receipt of the order. However, credit card orders must be declined with 24 hours (GSAM 552.232-79).
  - 3. Orders placed under this authority are subject to the Industrial Funding Fee (IFF) and should be reported quarterly on the contractor's 72a form under their Federal sales.
  - 4. The SPOCs ordering from the 1122 Program must be listed on the SPOC list which resides on <a href="http://www.gsa.gov/portal/content/202569">http://www.gsa.gov/portal/content/202569</a>.
  - 5. All orders require the mandated order language listed in the 1122 program catalog (www.gsa.gov/1122program)
  - 6. There is no modification required at this time to your Schedule contract in order to accept orders from the SPOCs.
