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# PREFACE

The Statistical Abstract of the United States, published annually since 1878, is the standard summary of statistics on the social, political, and economic organization of the United States. It is designed to serve as a convenient volume for statistical reference and as a guide to other statistical publications and sources. The latter function is served by the introductory text to each section, the source notes appearing below each table, the Guide to Sources, the section on Publications of Recent Censuses, and the Guide to State Statistical Abstracts.

This volume includes a selection of data from many statistical publications, both governmental and private. Publications cited as sources usually contain additional statistical detail and more comprehensive discussions of definitions and concepts than can be presented here. Data not available in publications issued by the contributing agency but obtained from the agency's unpublished tabulations and records are identified in the source notes as "unpublished data." More information on the subjects covered in tables so noted may generally be obtained from the source.

Except as otherwise indicated, figures are for the United States as presently constituted. Although emphasis in the Statistical Abstract is given primarily to national data, many tables present data for regions and individual States. Statistics for the Commonwealth of Puerto Rico and for outlying areas of the United States are included in the State tables whenever available and are supplemented by information in section 31. Statistics for cities or other relatively small geographic units appear only in a few instances. Additional information for cities, counties, metropolitan areas, congressional districts, and other small units, as well as more historical data, are available in various supplements to the Abstract. Changes in the 1970 edition.—This edition, the 91st annual issue, presents data for the most recent year or period available during the early part of 1970.

Each year the more than 1,300 tables and charts are reviewed and evaluated. New tables and charts of current interest are added, continuing series are brought up to date, and less timely data are curtailed or eliminated. Text notes are revised as necessary to incorporate new definitions and source references.

This year the new data emphasize social measures. Coverage of minority groups in the population has been increased substantially with new tables on Negro physicians (table 88), school enrollment (tables 172–175), Negro elected officials (table 546), voter registration and turnout (tables 554 and 556), and minority-owned businesses (table 710). In addition, many tables have been revised to cover minority group aspects of subjects which were, in past editions, more limited in presentation.

The continuing public interest in poverty is reflected in five new tables, including one specifically on Appalachia (table 506), and in new data on Federal food programs (tables 121-126), work and training programs (tables 203-205), public assistance recipients (table 450-451), and substandard housing (table 1094). There are also some new data on military affairs. Estimated costs of all American wars appear in table 371; changes in military occupations in table 393; and data on Selective Service Act violations in table 400. Pollution of the environment is covered in section 6, with new data on air pollutant emissions and solid waste collected (tables 264 and 265). The "Recent Trends" summary (p. xiii), introduced in the 1969 edition, has also been expanded to include a greater number of social and economic time series.

Section 33, "Metropolitan Area Statistics," introduced in the 1967 edition, has been updated for the fourth consecutive year. Reprints of this section may be obtained from the Superintendent of Documents, U.S. Government Printing Office, Washington, D.C. 20402. The price per copy is 35 cents; a discount of 25 percent is allowed on orders of 100 copies or more sent to the same address.

#### GUIDE TO TABULAR PRESENTATION

The following symbols, used in the tables throughout this book, are explained in condensed form in footnotes to the tables where they appear:

- Represents zero or rounds to less than half the unit of measurement shown.
- B Base figure too small to meet statistical standards for reliability of derived figure.
- D Figure withheld to avoid disclosure of information pertaining to a specific organization or individual.
- NA Data not enumerated, tabulated, or otherwise available separately.
- NS Percent change not relevant or significant.
- S Figure does not meet publication standards for reasons other than that covered by symbol B, above.
- X Figure not applicable because column heading and stub line make an entry impossible, absurd, or meaningless.
- Z Entry would amount to less than half the unit of measure shown.

Headnotes immediately below table titles provide information important for correct interpretation or evaluation of the table as a whole or for a major segment of it.

Footnotes below the bottom rule of tables give information relating to specific items or figures within the table.

Unit indicators ("In thousands," "In millions of dollars," etc.) are usually given in boldface type as the first element of the headnote. In tables where several units are used, the unit indicators are generally given in the stub or in the column headings.

Median: The value which divides the distribution into two equal parts—one-half the cases falling below this value and one-half exceeding it.

Parallel vertical rules are used to the right of a total column to indicate—

- (1) that the components which follow add to the total (e.g., tables 1, 3, 7, etc.);
- (2) in the case of derived figures, that the underlying data are additive to their total (e.g., table 15 for percentages, table 22 for ratios, table 56 for rates, table 86 for averages, and table 162 for medians).

Heavy vertical rules are used-

- (1) in tables where the stub (the area, date, or descriptive column at the left) is continued into one or more additional columns across the table to separate each segment of stub and its accompanying data columns from the continued segments (e.g., tables 2, 4, 6, etc.);
- (2) to set off independent sections of a table (e.g., tables 1, 3, 5, etc.).

In many tables, details will not add to the totals shown because of rounding.


