#### Military Installations, Ranges, and Training Areas (point locations and boundaries) Version 2.0 October 17, 2011

#### Overview

This geospatial dataset contains the authoritative point locations and (where available) boundaries of 818 Department of Defense sites, commonly referred to as installations, ranges and training areas. These installations are, in many cases, comprised of a number of subordinate sites. This list does not necessarily represent a comprehensive collection of all Department of Defense facilities, and only those in the fifty United States and US Territories were considered for inclusion. Points are placed either at the center of each site or near the center of the most actively used portion of the site. Boundaries encompass federally owned or otherwise managed lands, as defined in the Federal Real Property Profile. The point and boundary location datasets are intended for planning purposes only, and do not represent the legal or surveyed land parcel boundaries. Please use these release notes and the accompanying metadata to validate whether this dataset is suitable for your intended use.

#### Sources

The primary source for this location data is the DoD Components (Army, Navy, Air Force, Marine Corps, Washington Headquarters Service). Only sites reported in the 2010 Base Structure Report (BSR) were considered for inclusion. Some sites were not included because geospatial data were not available, or it is a leased site.

#### **Data Structure**

The aggregated data are in shapefile format, organized by point and boundary datasets (see files named "Military\_Installations\_Ranges\_Training\_Areas\_Pt" and "Military\_Installations\_Ranges\_Training\_Areas\_Bnd"). Each dataset is further organized according to Service and their respective component. All data conforms to the WGS84 datum (decimal degrees) and the Department's Spatial Data Standard for Facilities, Infrastructure, and Environment v3.0.

The following attributes are included in the data:

Comprehensive ISO-compliant metadata is included with the data. Please review the contents of the .xml files for the point and boundary shapefiles.

### Data Quality

While every attempt has been made to provide the best available data quality, this data set is intended for use at mapping scales between 1:50,000 and 1:3,000,000. For this reason, boundaries in this data set may not perfectly align with DoD site boundaries depicted in other federal data sources. Maps produced at a scale of 1:50,000 or smaller which otherwise comply with National Map Accuracy Standards, will remain compliant when this data is incorporated. Boundary data is most effective when used for larger scale maps; point locations are better suited for mapping scales between 1:250,000 and 1:3,000,000.

### **Base Closure Note**

If an included site was selected for closure during any of the base realignment and closure (BRAC) rounds it is attributed as a "BRAC Site." Retention of a small enclave, not associated with the main mission of the base, is still a closure. No distinction is made between sites selected for closure in 2005 versus those selected in 1988, 1991, 1993 or 1995.

## Joint Base Note

If an included site has become part of a Joint Base (effective/designated on 1 October, 2010) as required under the 2005 Base Realignment and Closure process, it is attributed with the name of the Joint Base. These Joint Bases will be reported in future BSRs by the responsible DoD Component, although in this data set they remain attributed with the Component which reported them in 2010.

### Acronyms

DoD site names frequently contain acronyms to describe the site. The following chart defines those acronyms which appear in the data.
