- BTF encourages the interoperability and data/information sharing among approved DoD, Interagency, and Multinational partners. The ability to protect U.S. national interests requires the highest levels of biometric interoperability. A lack of trust continues to exist among biometrics data/information sharing partners, impeding the needed interoperability between the BTF and its partners. <u>How can DoD, USG Agencies, and Multinational countries develop the level of trust to improve the interoperability and data/information sharing among all levels of partnership?
