Dr. Thomas Killion named BIMA director

Crystal City, VA. OC T 26, 2010 – Dr. Thomas Killion, the former Chief Scientist of the U.S. Army, has been named Director of the Biometrics Identity Management Agency (BIMA) effective October 26, 2010.

Dr. Killion succeeds Dr. Myra S. Gray, who assumes new responsibilities as G-5 for the U.S. A rmy M ateriel C ommand. Dr. Gray became D irector of what was then known as the G-3/5/7 Biometrics Task Force on July 8, 2007 and has spent more than three years overseeing the development of DoD bi ometrics policies and enterprise solutions. The Task Force was redesignated as the BIMA on March 23, 2010.

In J uly 2010, D r. K illion w as det ailed t o t he J oint I ED D efeat O rganization (JIEDDO) to serve as Science Advisor to the Director. In that capacity, he provided scientific and t echnical advice on programs, developed as ystematic Science and Technology (S&T) strategy and roadmap to help guide J IEDDO investments and engaged with S&T organizations within the Department of Defense, other Departments, industry, academia and internationally to leverage their efforts to counter the threat of IEDs.

From March 2004 through June 2010, Dr. Killion served as the Deputy Assistant Secretary of the Army for Research and Technology (DASA(R&T)) and Chief Scientist. He was responsible for the entire Army Research and Technology program, spanning 21 laboratories and research, development and engineering centers, more than 10,000 scientists and engineers and a 6-year budget of more than \$11 billion.
