ASEV done & won! Excellence earned in AMC Aircrew Standardization & Evaluation Visit

Being declared "Mission Ready" is the end goal of every ASEV – Aircrew Standardization and Evaluation Visit – and the 166th Airlift Wing has once again earned that recognition of accomplishment and preparedness in the overall assessment of the wing provided by the HQ Air Mobility Command Inspector General Team.

Over 200 Airmen in the 166th Operations group were closely inspected in the every five year process to evaluate how aircrew from the wing perform their duties and responsibilities on the ground, in-flight and administratively. Examiners check to ensure crews accomplish their jobs safely and according to regulatory and flight-manual

guidance, and to measure the wing's capability of performing its assigned airlift mission.

The full-blown ASEV visit by the entire AMC team to the New Castle Air

National Guard Base to inspect the wing began April 11 and ended on April 18, but the 166th Operations Group has been

a buzz of activity since the start of the New Year when some portions of the evaluations began.

The AMC HQ IG team grades directive/program compliance and aircrew performance through flight evaluations and testing. Program grading covers four main areas, and is based on a five tier system; Outstanding, Excellent, Satisfactory, Marginal, and Unsatisfactory. The final unit grade is either Mission Ready or Unsatisfactory.

During the April 18 out-brief to

the wing, AMC IG Team Chief Lt. Col. Matthew Holm, after noting that three of the four major graded areas received a Satisfactory rating, and one major graded area received an Excellent rating, said, "Satisfactory is good, and I am glad to see you applauding, Brig. Gen. Timmons!" as he took note of Brig. Gen. Carol Timmons' reaction to his concluding remarks.

"Yeah!" declared Gen. Timmons, the Assistant Adjutant General for Air, Delaware National Guard, as she addressed wing members after the departure of the inspectors. "Good job! Great job! Me and Jon [Col. Jonathan Groff, wing commander] weren't worried about it. We know you can fly and we know you can do the mission."

"This was the culmination of two years of preparation. The bookwork was outstanding, and so were the aircrews," said Col. Jonathan Groff.

There are four graded areas; Aircrew Performance, Tactics, Training and Stan/Eval (Standardization/Evaluation).

Aircrew Performance received an overall grade of EXCELLENT. It is

Wing Facebook page approaches 500 page "Likes," surpasses 3,700 people reached a week

The week leading up to the May 5-6, 2012 Unit Training Assembly we reached 490 page "Likes" on the 166th Airlift Wing Facebook page, www.facebook.com/166thAirliftWing. Within a matter of days the page should surpass 500 Likes.

In the first week in May the page had just over 100 people in the "People Talking About This" page category, and just over 300 people in the "Were Here" category; each number is a good trend.

Other positive trends show up in Facebook "Insights," metrics that measure visitor interaction with a page. There were 3,770 people reached the week ending May 4, 2012, breaking the old record of 2,421 people reached the week ending April 17, 2012. The milestone of 1,000 people reached was passed in early April, the ninth month our page has been in operation.

Our wing page has maintained its position in the top half of all ANG C-130 airlift wings in page Likes, and is on the way to surpassing one additional sister ANG C-130 airlift wing in

comprised of two sub-sections: Aircrew Performance, with a combined average score of 96.93 percent on the closed book exams and the open book exams, and Flight Evaluations, with 35 flight evaluations, and no downgrades on any flight areas. One pilot, Maj. Jason Strickland, was rated exceptionally qualified.

Tactics received an overall grade of SATISFACTORY. There are six programs: Staffing, Functions and Responsibilities; Mission Planning, Deployment and Execution; Improvement and Assessment Program Administration; Electronic Combat Officer Duties; Formal/Unit Training; and Joint Airdrop Inspection.

Training received an overall grade of SATISFACTORY: There are seven programs; Administration; Training Review Panel; Training Folders; Qualification Training; Continuation Training; Host Aviation Resource Management; and Squadron Aviation Resource Management.

Stan/Eval received an overall grade of SATISFACTORY: There are four programs; Stan/Eval Administration; Flight Evaluation Folders; Go/No-Go; and Aeromedical Equipment. The Aeromedical Equipment program received an EXCELLENT rating, with five individuals pointed out by name by the AMC HQ IG Team Chief for exceptional performance; they are Capt. Maureen Mulrooney, 2nd

Lt. Tim Stoeckle, Tech. Sgt. Tonya Ingram, Tech. Sgt. Thomas Vaughan, and Senior Airman Ronald Sereny.

Other top performers mentioned by name by the IG Team: Senior Master Sgt. Jamie Kohr of the 166th Operations Group and Staff Sgt. Thomas Morris of the 142nd Aeromedical Evacuation Squadron.

The team gave Special Recognition to Maj. Jeremy Mertz for providing excellent support of the IG Team.

The unit has performed well on their last two ASEVs; after the June 2006 and June 2002 ASEVs, the flying units of the 166th OG received ratings of excellent on their overall flying performance, and the wing received a final grade of "Mission Ready" in each of those years.
