

A DLA recruiter attended the Miami University Career Fair in Oxford, Ohio on September 19, 2012. Miami University is a public university established in 1809. One of Miami University's most famous graduates was Benjamin Harrison, who later became President of the United States. Enrollments at the main campus include 14,936 undergraduates and 2,298 graduate students. Miami offers bachelor degrees in over 100 areas of study and master degrees in more than 50 areas. Miami also offers a number of doctoral degrees. In the 2013 edition of *America's Best Colleges*, U.S. News & World Report ranks Miami 3rd among the nation's top universities for its commitment to undergraduate teaching. The *Fiske Guide to Colleges 2013* includes Miami in its list of the nation's "best and most interesting colleges and universities." Recognized for strong programs in architecture, business, and music, Miami is "gaining national recognition as an excellent state university that has the true look and feel of a private school, with a picture-perfect campus and high-caliber student body," according to the guide. Miami is recognized in the Princeton Review's annual flagship college guide. In addition to outstanding academics—the primary criteria for selection—Miami was described as having a "vibrant, social atmosphere" and an "astoundingly beautiful" campus.
