U.S. AIR FORCE SUMMER INTERNSHIP PROGRAM

The United States Air Force is currently looking for Electrical, Computer, and Environmental Engineering students interested in an internship opportunity that allows them to work at an Air Force Research Lab during the summer between their sophomore and junior years of college.

Students will work at the research labs, located at six different Air Force bases throughout the United States, for a 10 week period. In addition to paying students a salary of approximately \$4,500.00 for the 10 weeks, the Air Force will also pay for round-trip airfare, lodging and living expenses (approximately \$6,000) and rental vehicle costs.

Students who complete the program may be offered a follow-on AFROTC scholarship for the remainder of your degree program. This scholarship pays 100% of tuition and fees, \$900.00 per year for books and you get a \$450.00 to \$500.00 tax-free monthly stipend.

Not only does this program offer the benefits of resume-worthy experience, competitive pay and scholarship opportunity—it also lays the foundation for a career opportunity as an Engineering Officer in the United States Air Force.
