ABERDEEN PROVING GROUND (APG), the Army's oldest active proving ground, was established on October 20, 1917, six months after the United States entered World War I. It remains one of the Army's most active and diversified installations. Situated at the mouth of the Chesapeake Bay and bordered by the Susquehanna and Gunpowder Rivers, APG is surrounded by some of the best natural resources that Maryland has to offer. Located along the I-95 corridor, APG is approximately 74 miles driving distance to Philadelphia, 71 miles to Washington, D.C. and 32 miles to Baltimore.

The U.S. Army Edgewood Chemical Biological Center (ECBC) is the nation's principal research and development resource for non-medical Chemical and Biological (CB) Defense. As a critical national asset in the CB Defense community, ECBC supports all phases of the acquisition life cycle from basic and applied research through technology development, engineering design, equipment evaluation, product support, sustainment, field operations and demilitarization to address its customers' unique requirements.

DIRECTIONS TO EDGEWOOD AREA OF APG

From Baltimore:

- I-95 North to Exit 77A (MD Route 24 South).
- Proceed approximately 4 miles to the Edgewood Area gate.

From Delaware:

- I-95 South to Exit 77A (MD Route 24 South).
- Proceed approximately 4 miles to the Edgewood Area gate.

From BWI Airport:

- I-195 West.
- Exit 2A, MD 295 North (Balti-Wash Parkway) toward I-695/Baltimore.
- Take the I-895 Harbor Tunnel Exit.
- I-895 Harbor Tunnel merges with I-95 North.
- I-95 North to Exit 77A (MD Route 24 South).
- Proceed approximately 4 miles to the Edgewood Area gate.

Visitors WITH a valid Government ID (CAC or other Government ID) Stop at the entrance and present guard with ID.


Visitors WITHOUT a Government ID


CITIZENSHIP REQUIREMENTS:

DIRECTIONS TO ECBC BUILDINGS

From Gate to Building E3330:

- At the first traffic light, turn left onto Magnolia Road.
- Continue on Magnolia Road (runs parallel to the airfield on the right and turns into Ricketts Point Road).
- Turn right into parking lot entrance and park.
- Building E3330 will be across the street.

From Gate to Building E3549 (Berger Building):

- At the first traffic light, turn left onto Magnolia Road.
- Continue on Magnolia Road (runs parallel to the airfield on the right and turns into Ricketts Point Road).
- Turn left into parking lot entrance and park.

From Gate to Building E3150 (McNamara Building):

- At the first traffic light, turn left onto Magnolia Road.
- Continue on Magnolia Road (runs parallel to the airfield on the right and turns into Ricketts Point Road).
- Turn left onto North Kings Creek which will dead-end into building E3150.
