DSA REGULATION NO. 4235.1

SUBSISTENCE REQUIREMENTS DATA (RCS DD-DSA(SA)40(0), DD-DSA(AR)41(0), DD-DSA(AR)42(0))

I. REFERENCES

- A. DoD Directive 5105.22, Defense Supply Agency (DSA).
- B. DSA Regulation 4235.3, Programming of New or Improved Subsistence Items Requiring Special Funding into the Military Supply System.

II. PURPOSE

This DSAR prescribes procedures for reporting by the Military Services to the Defense Personnel Support Center (DPSC) the following: $\frac{1}{2}$

- A. Subsistence supply planning and usage data necessary in the forecasting of recurring demand type items.
- B. Subsistence requirements forecast for Military Service Controlled Items.
 - C. Data on new food items (see reference I B above).
 - D. Utilization data on those items requiring immediate consumption.

III. SCOPE

This DSAR is applicable to HQ DSA, the DPSC, Army, Navy, Marine Corps, and Air Force. It is fully applicable under peacetime, limited war, or general war conditions. It has been coordinated with and concurred in by the Military Services. The term requirement(s), as used herein, is equally applicable to troop feeding and specification type items sold in Commissary Stores. The computation of mobilization requirements is excluded from this regulation, as this area is covered by separate instruction.

IV. GENERAL

A. <u>Background</u>. The DPSC computes replenishment requirements for depot stocked food items in accordance with reference I A above. Requirements are based on past demand adjusted over the forecast period through use of program data and other influencing factors.

This DSAR supersedes DSAR 4235.1/AR 31-4/BUSANDAINST 4442.8/MCO 10110.19, 25 Aug 65.

B. Definitions

- 1. <u>CONUS</u>. The term as used herein is applicable to activities/installations located within the continental United States, excluding Alaska and Hawaii.
- 2. <u>Distribution Area</u>. The geographical area, both in CONUS and in overseas areas, which is designated for mission support by a DSA Materiel Distribution System depot for specific commodities. Demands of all CONUS and overseas installations located within or assigned to the specific distribution area of a DSA depot will be recorded for that storage activity for purposes of determining the range and depth of stock positioning (see Enclosure 1 for distribution area breakdown).
- 3. <u>Feeding Strength</u>. The average number of personnel for whom subsistence will be requisitioned for troop issue by the Military Service having responsibility for subsistence support. Personnel expected to be absent will be excluded.
- 4. Military Service Controlled Item. An item for which the Military Services place irregular and unpredictable demands on the DPSC, not regularly consumed in troop feeding, but held for specific purposes such as war reserve, survival feeding, or training. Examples are combat rations, peculiar B rations, and survival food packets.
- 5. New Item. An item entering the DSA supply system resulting from one of the following:
 - a. Research, development, and standardization action.
 - b. Specification revision which changes the item or concept of use.
 - c. Adoption for use of an existing item by a Military Service not previously a user.
 - d. Cognizance transfer to the DSA supply system directed by higher authority.
- 6. Overseas. All areas outside the continental limits of the United States, including Alaska and Hawaii.
- 7. Recurring Requirements. Those requirements which are sufficiently repetitive in nature to permit the accumulation and use of demand history in the forecasting of future requirements.



8. <u>Supply Planning and Usage Data</u>. Information which would have a significant affect on requirements computations. Examples are: military personnel strengths; item deletions, substitutions and/or changes in planned usages; introduction of new items and relative affect of such new items on requirements of previously used items; or large scale maneuvers involving movements of military personnel between distribution areas.

V. RESPONSIBILITIES

A. The Chief, Supply Management Division, Executive Directorate, Supply Operations, HQ DSA is responsible for maintaining this DSAR in a current status and reviewing it annually.

B. The Commander, DPSC will:

- 1. Forecast requirements for subsistence items based on:
 - a. Demand data available to DPSC.
 - b. Supply planning and usage data as described in paragraph VI.
- 2. Notify the Military Services when food stocks require special planned utilization in order to avoid loss to the Government, such as stocks of rotation items, or stocks of items in long supply, or items approaching expiration of shelf life.
- 3. Furnish listings to the Military Services designating frequency of procurement, procurement review months where applicable, procurement leadtime, and the delivery periods covered by the scheduled procurement.

C. The Military Services will:

- 1. Furnish DPSC supply planning and usage data as prescribed in paragraph VI.
- 2. Coordinate changes in planned usage with DPSC prior to implementation to assure timely utilization of DSA assets and consideration of changes in any pending procurement.
- 3. Furnish requirements to DPSC for Military Service controlled items as prescribed in paragraph $VI\ A\ 3$.

4. Furnish "Planned Utilization of Specified Subsistence Stocks" data to DPSC when assisting in utilization of subsistence stocks as described in paragraph V B 2.

VI. REPORTS

A. Supply Planning Data

1. $\frac{\text{Military Personnel Strength Projections.}}{\text{report projected quarterly feeding strengths for CONUS}}$ and overseas respectively by distribution area (column a through i) on DD Form 1528, RCS-DD-DSA(SA)40(0), Military Personnel Strength Projections for the next eight quarters, to the DPSC, semiannually, on 1 January and 1 July of each year and whenever changes of 20% or more occur.

2. Requirements Forecasts for New Items and Phased Rate of Replacement for Changed Usage or Deleted Items

a. New Items. Upon determination that a new item can be made available by DPSC, the Military Services will submit estimated quantitative requirements by distribution area for eight quarters on DD Form 1529, Forecast of New, Changed Usage, and/or Deleted Items, RCS-DD-DSA(AR)41(0), which provides requirements forecasts for new items and phased rate of replacement for changed usage or deleted items (see reference I B in regard to the introduction of new subsistence items).

b. Changed Usage or Deletion

- (1) As a result of replacement in part or in total by a new item, if anticipated quarterly demand on an item will be decreased by 20% or more, a DD Form 1529 will be furnished to DPSC indicating by distribution area the percentage decrease for each projected quarter, considering the current quarter as a base. For example, the introduction of fruit premix as a new item caused substantial decreases in demands for the fruit component and for filler.
- (2) As a result of increased/decreased item usage, if the anticipated quarterly demand of an item will be changed by 20% or more, a DD Form 1529 will be furnished to DPSC indicating by distribution area the



percentage change for each projected quarter, considering the current quarter as a base. For example, increased usage of spreads in jars and a corresponding decrease in usage of spreads in cans.

3. Military Service Controlled Items

- a. The Military Services will furnish to DPSC, by 1 December of each year, item requirements for those Military Service controlled items mutually agreed upon between DPSC and the Military Services. Required data will be submitted on DD Form 1529, RCS-DD-DSA(AR)41(0M).
 - (1) The phrase "Service controlled" will be added to the "X applicable Item" block .
 - (2) "Direct Deliveries" and "Shipments from Depots" will be entered separately under "Distribution Area".
- b. A revised forecast will be furnished whenever circumstances create a change of 20% or more in previously forecasted requirements.
- c. The annual forecast for items procured seasonally will be reviewed by the Military Services in sufficient time to permit submission of any changes at least 30 days prior to the DPSC procurement review date.
- 4. Navy Ship Loadings. A schedule of planned loadings of fleet replenishment ships dry and reefer will be submitted annually by 1 December for the succeeding calendar year. Advance information on changes to the schedule will be furnished at the earliest possible time. Unscheduled loadings will be reported as soon as such information is available. Fleet Issue Load List applicable to the Atlantic and Pacific Fleets will be provided in accordance with DSAM 4140.2/AR 735-110/NAVSUP Pub 5003/MCO P4400.101, Volume 1, Chapter 9.
- 5. Additional Information. The Military Services will report to DPSC any additional information that may become available which would significantly affect demand. An example would be retail stocks in long supply affecting projected depot demand, by quantity and distribution area.



B. Planned Utilization of Specified Subsistence Stocks

- 1. The Military Services, when necessary, to preclude loss to the Government, will be requested to assist in utilizing stocks of subsistence items requiring immediate consumption. DPSC will allocate quantities of such items on the basis of actual past demands for each Service. Only CONUS troop demand drawn from a sample of fast moving, nonperishable subsistence items, common to all Services, will be considered.
- 2. Upon receipt of notification of specified subsistence items requiring utilization, the Military Services will forward to DPSC a report on DD Form 1530, Planned Utilization of Specified Subsistence Stocks, RCS-DD-DSA(AR)42(0). The report will be furnished in duplicate and the information will be reflected by calendar year quarters and by distribution areas. This information is required in order to position specified stocks in appropriate storage locations. Status reports on the utilization of such stocks will be furnished to the Military Services on a quarterly frequency until all quantities have been utilized.
