SUBJECT: Policy for Military Health System Operating Systems

This memorandum supercedes Health Affairs Policy Memorandum 96-058 of August 26, 1996 and establishes Office of the Assistant Secretary of Defense (Health Affairs) (OASD (HA)) policy for Military Health System (MHS) client and server operating systems. By limiting the number and diversity of operating systems, the MHS will achieve economies of scale, increase interoperability, and reduce complexity in network configuration. Moreover, decreasing diversity in operating systems within the MHS furthers business process reengineering by simplifying the integration of common functions and by allowing a single, integrated information management approach.

This policy establishes Windows 2000 Server and Windows 2000 Professional Desktop as the standard MHS operating systems for new acquisitions. These operating systems provide for a secure, high performance environment that has broad industry application support, and supports portability to diverse hardware platforms. All MHS programs are directed to test centrally managed applications prior to implementation in a Windows 2000 environment.

Windows 2000 Professional Desktop and Server are currently delivered with new system purchases and may be implemented on existing systems as long as it does not cause conflict with MHS mission critical functionality. Current MHS policy on minimum hardware requirements for servers and PCs meet or exceed the minimum requirements for a Windows 2000 installation.

All activities within the MHS shall defer implementation of Active Directory until an approved directory schema is finalized. Implementation of a consistent Active Directory naming structure within the MHS will provide the highest level of interoperability. This will allow the Medical Services to exchange Active Directory architectural information. The Technical Integration Working Group, in coordination with the Services, is charged with the oversight of the development of an MHS Active Directory structure.

Waivers to any part of this policy will be evaluated on a case-by-case basis and shall be forwarded in accordance with the attachment.
