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

S.Report 107-084 - Labor, HHS, Education and Related Agencies Appropriations Bill 2002

The Committee has included \$3,000,000 to establish a National Suicide Prevention Resource Center to provide technical assistance in developing, implementing and evaluating effective suicide prevention programs. The Resource Center will provide training and field support and serve as a clearinghouse for all pertinent best practices information regarding suicide prevention. The Center should promote evaluation of suicide prevention programs to ensure that effective techniques, strategies, and recommended best practices are made available to users.








- Goal 1. Enhance the size and capacity of the suicide prevention workforce
- Goal 2. Create a national network of communities of practice by connecting regional, state, and local networks, organizations, and practitioners engaged in suicide prevention
- Goal 3. Create and disseminate resources
- Goal 4. Support mechanisms for implementing the public health approach to suicide prevention
- Goal 5. Broaden participation in suicide prevention activities and integrate suicide prevention into existing activities and programs

 - 40 trainings in 2009

- Four online training courses on youth suicide prevention with two more to come

- Facilitate peer-to-peer networking and communication among Grantees








The purpose of the BPR is to identify, review, and disseminate information about best practices that address specific objectives of the *National Strategy* for Suicide Prevention (NSSP)


"Practices" is defined broadly, including programs, policies, protocols, awareness materials, etc.
