Research


- Purpose: Quantitative study of the effects of certain business environment factors on the level of economic development of the largest 100 federally recognized tribes (by population) in the lower 48 states
- No current comprehensive, substantive data to support tribes, federal agencies, and others in policy development to guide initiatives
- Status:
 - Notification and consent letters sent to all tribal elected leaders
 - Researcher surveying tribes
 - Also using data from Census publications, websites, previous
 Department of Justice surveys, data collected by others (e.g., Harvard Project, Tiller's Guide) and more
 - Contract with economist to conduct analysis of data
 - White paper will be completed by 4th Quarter 2012
 - Planning to host an event to share findings
