Lean Manufacturing techniques were implemented to achieve success in meeting new workload challenges in an era of Chemical and Biological threats. The depot entered partnerships and worked on Biological Integrated Detection Systems, Dry Filter Units and Portal Shields and hundreds of generators...

Soldiers lived in Force Provider's (tent cities) overhauled on the depot and unknown numbers of lives were saved through various Armor protection projects produced at record-breaking schedules to enhance Soldier safety.
