There are 172 enlisted musicians in the Navy Band, led by four officers.

The commanding officer of the U.S. Navy Band is Capt. Brian O. Walden (bio).

There are six major performing ensembles in the Navy Band: the Concert Band, Ceremonial Band, Sea Chanters chorus, Commodores jazz ensemble, Country Current country/bluegrass ensemble, and the Cruisers popular music group.

The Navy Band is based in Washington, D.C., at the historic Washington Navy Yard.

Ensembles from the Navy Band are touring nationally 12 weeks each year.

Sailors in the Navy Band are fulltime professional musicians.

Almost all of the Sailors in the Navy Band have undergraduate degrees in music, and most have graduate degrees.
