



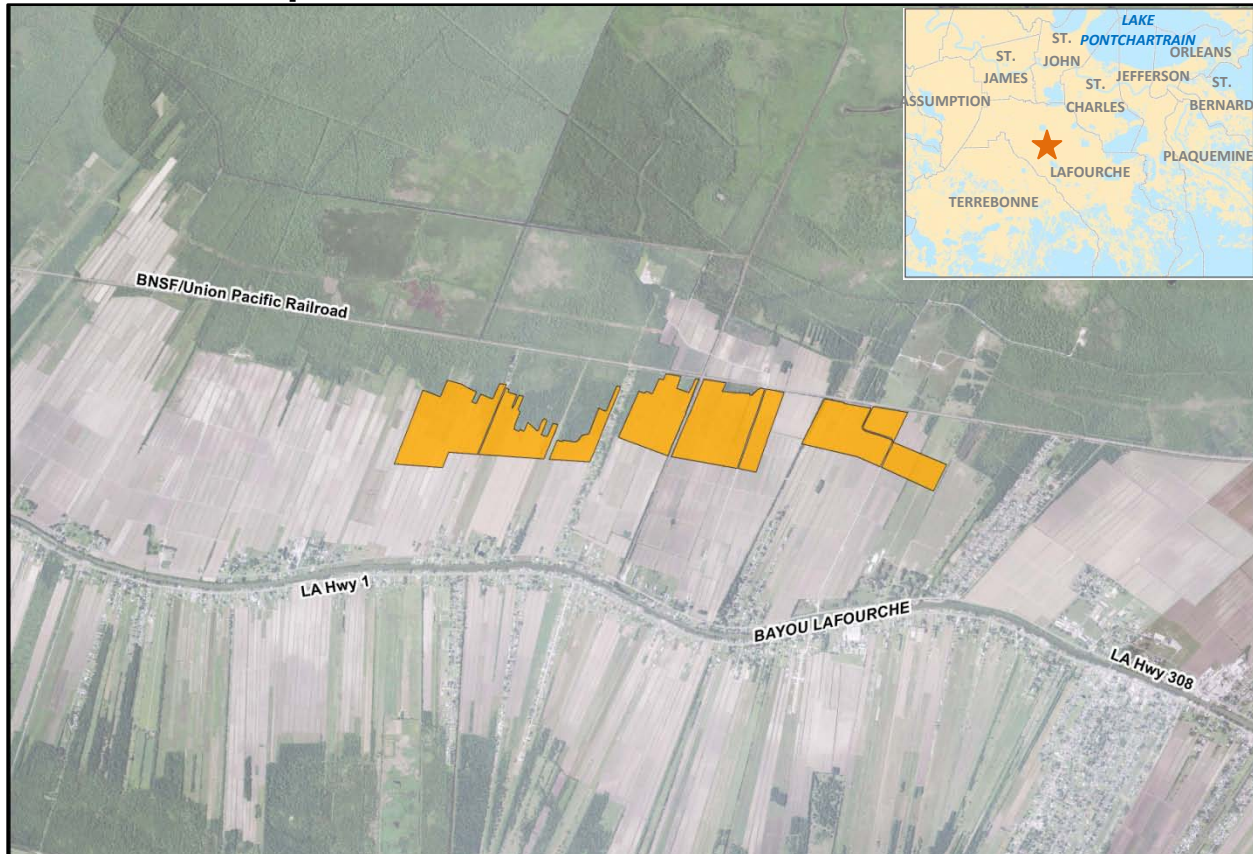

General Impacts – Lake Boeuf Bottomland Hardwood Wet



Project Purpose

The purpose of this project is to mitigate for the unavoidable impacts incurred to floodside bottomland hardwood wetland (BLH-Wet) habitat during construction of the Hurricane & Storm Damage Risk Reduction System.

Project Location

This project is located on existing agricultural fields between the Lake Boeuf Wildlife Management Area and Bayou Lafourche near the town of Raceland in Lafourche Parish, Louisiana.

Features

Approximately 409 acres of BLH-Wet would be restored through clearing and grading to achieve target BLH elevation, followed by planting of native BLH-Wet species. Culverts would be added to existing roads that pass through the project site to ensure unimpeded water flow.
