

DRMS Environmental Management System (EMS) Information for Contractors

Executive Order (E.O.) 13148 directed the implementation of an Environmental Management System (EMS) at all DOD appropriate facilities by December 31, 2005. The Defense Reutilization and Marketing Service (DRMS), a Primary Level Field Activity (PLFA) of the Defense Logistics Agency (DLA), implemented EMS in accordance with ISO 14001:2004(E), DOD and DLA requirements at all DRMS appropriate facilities. EMS programs are also implemented at appropriate facilities operated by other PLFAs within DLA to include facilities of the Defense Supply Centers (Columbus, OH, Philadelphia, PA., and Richmond, VA.), Defense Logistics Information Service (DLIS), Document Automation and Production Service (DAPS), Defense Distribution Center (DDC), Defense Energy Support Center (DESC) and the Defense National Stockpile Center (DNSC). An EMS is an overall management system that includes organizational structure, planning activities, responsibilities, practices, procedures, processes and resources for developing, implementing, achieving, reviewing and maintaining the environmental policy of an organization. The DRMS EMS is designed to ensure that all personnel, including contract personnel, whose work activities can cause real or potential significant environmental impact, are aware of how their work supports the EMS and are competent to perform their roles, responsibilities and authorities while supporting the DRMS mission. The successful implementation of the DRMS EMS depends on a commitment from and the inclusion of, all persons working for DRMS or on its behalf.

DRMS implemented an EMS program at each appropriate facility that conforms to ISO 14001:2004(E), Department of Defense, and Defense Logistics Agency requirements. The DRMS EMS program is described fully in DRMS-I 6050.2, Environmental Management System (EMS) Core Instruction.

The DRMS-I 6050.2 is the basic building block of the DRMS EMS program. Guidance in the DRMS-I 6050.2 applies to every appropriate facility within DRMS. Each DRMS appropriate facility customizes the information within DRMS-I 6050.2 by creating a unique site supplement specific to their location. Site supplements detail information required by EMS at a local level such as local, state and host environmental regulations as well as local emergency procedures and operating procedures unique to the location. Site supplements also contain information concerning the local interaction between the DRMS tenant appropriate facility and the DOD/DLA host facility EMS program.

Contractors and their personnel are required to be aware that each DRMS appropriate facility has an EMS per hazardous waste contract requirements. Clause C.1.1.1, Permit/Special Requirements, requires hazardous waste disposal contractors to be aware of EMS policies to perform work and/or gain access to an installation. FAR clause 52.223-5 (c)(7) and (c)(8), Pollution Prevention and Right-to-Know Information, requires contractors to provide information needed by a facility to maintain an EMS per section 401 of E.O. 13148.

Each DRMS appropriate facility maintains EMS awareness posters that identify the DRMS Environmental Management Representative (EMR) and Host facility EMR for specific guidance concerning an individual facilities' EMS program. The current list of DRMS appropriate facilities is attached. Contractors should be aware that DRMS appropriate facilities are tenant facilities located on host facilities that also have their own EMS programs.
