"Source Selection" means evaluating a bid or proposal to enter into an agency procurement contract.

FAR 15.3

"The objective of **source selection** is to select the proposal that represents the best value."



DoD has created Department-wide guidance on Source Selection

TMA's Source Selection Directive has several new requirements



The Directive:

- Mandates the use of a new <u>TMA Source Selection Plan</u> <u>Guide and Template</u> as a model for all competitively negotiated source selections (FAR Part 15)
- Requires the CO to use the <u>Debriefing Guide</u> to debrief offerors
- Requires the CO to submit source selection documents to the BOR and OGC



TMA's Source Selection Directive has several new requirements



- The Directive requires all government personnel involved in source selection to:
 - Complete TMA Form 821, Non-Disclosure Statement;
 - Become familiar with the requirements established by the Office of Federal Procurement Policy and <u>FAR Subpart</u> 3.104;
 - Consider source selection a primary responsibility.



The evaluation criteria for source selection have been updated



- One additional rating category has been added: Good
- The rating categories are now:
 - Outstanding
 - Good
 - Acceptable
 - Marginal
 - Unacceptable
