SUBJECT: LEE HARVEY OSWALD
INTERNAL SECURITY - R

On November 26, 1963, [EXEMPT] Production Group B (Cuban) of National Security Agency (NSA), contacted Liaison Agent to advise that NSA is undertaking a project to determine whether recent radio traffic between Cuba and the U.S. may possibly contain any information of significance in captioned case, particularly any information which might indicate a connection between the Cuban Government and Oswald's assassination of President Kennedy.

[EXEMPT] stated that NSA has in their files copies of numerous radio messages between the U.S. and Cuba obtained through NSA monitoring activities; that this traffic, which averages approximately 1,000 messages per day, is much too voluminous for an examination of each message; and that through a mechanical computer process, they intend to select for further examination any message sent during the past three months which might contain the name of Oswald. They also desire to include in this computer project a selection of messages containing the names of any close associates of Oswald, particularly in the Fair Play for Cuba Committee, as well as any significant addresses which may have been found among Oswald's effects.

[EXEMPT] asked whether we could review the results of our investigations of Oswald and furnish NSA a list of his more significant contacts as well as addresses found in his effects.

After checking with the Espionage Section, Liaison furnished [EXEMPT] the full name of subject's wife and the alias, Hidell, which he used in purchasing the murder weapon by mail. He was advised that our investigation in this case is still under way, that it is very extensive, and that upon completion we will review the results for the purpose of determining whether there are additional logical names or addresses pertinent to the NSA project. [EXEMPT] advised that they will immediately make the first run on this project with the names



He said that the project is considered very urgent at NSA, and they would appreciate receiving from us as soon as possible any additional significant names and addresses. He also advised that should any significant data be developed by NSA, it will be referred to us immediately.

Espionage Section will give consideration as to additional names and addresses we may be able to furnish NSA from results of our investigations of this subject.

GILBERTO POLICARPO LOPEZ aka GILBERTO LOPEZ RODRIGUEZ

Born January 26, 1940, in Havana Cuba.

Lopez allegedly was at the home of Mary Quist in Tampa, Florida, on November 17, 1963, awaiting a telephone call from Cuba. The telephone call supposedly was to give him the "go ahead order" to leave the United States. Lopez apparently received such a telephone call sometime between November 17 and November 20, because on the latter date he obtained an entry permit for Mexico.

A Mrs. Manuel (Christina) Amor, 8407 39th Street, Tampa, Florida, telephoned sometime after 5:00 a.m. on December 8, 1963, a friend in Cuba named Teresa and was told Lopez had arrived safely in Cuba via Texas and Mexico.
